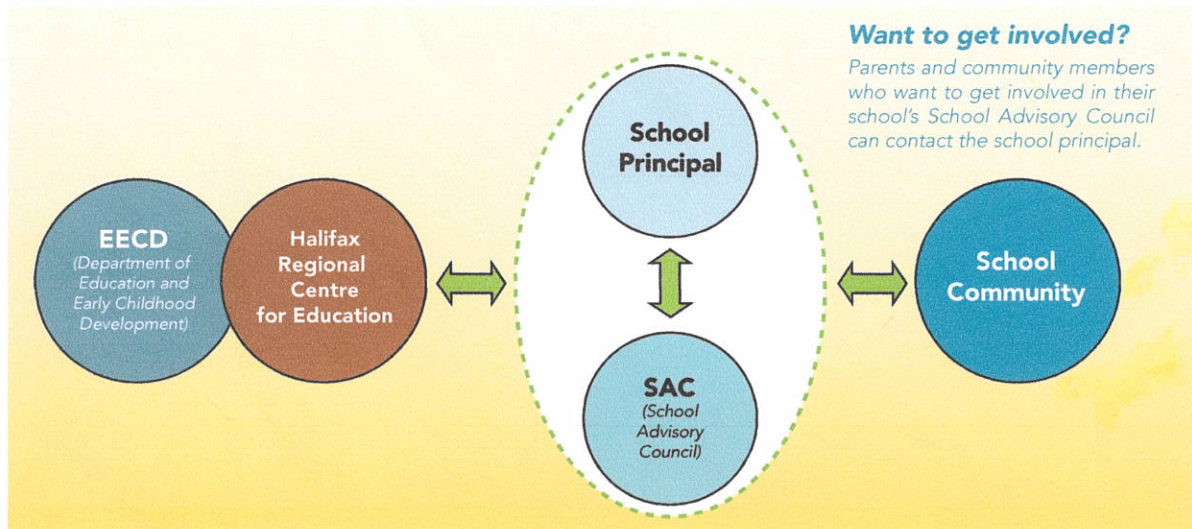


School Advisory Council Communication

School Advisory Councils (SACs) are voluntary bodies who receive their authority from the Nova Scotia Education Act. SACs bring parents, community members, staff, and where appropriate, students, together to offer advice to principals and Regional Centres for Education (RCEs) in their decision-making. Effective communication flow is a critical component to ensure the success of School Advisory Councils.



- The school principal works closely with their SAC to maintain effective communication between the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD), the RCE and the school community.
- Most of the communication between the SAC, RCE and EECD flows through the school principal. *Who do you call if you have a question or concern? Please start with your school principal.*
- After speaking with the school principal, if you feel your concern has not been addressed, the next point of contact would be the School Administration supervisor for your Family of Schools (FOS).
